

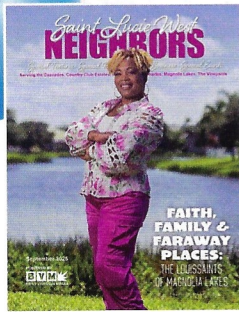

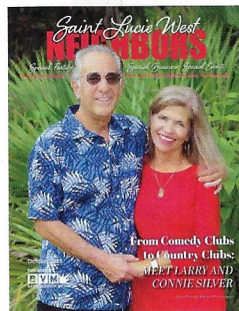

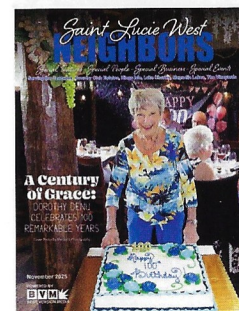


OCTOBER 2025

Their feature reflected a partnership rooted in resilience, shared values, and a love for community life.



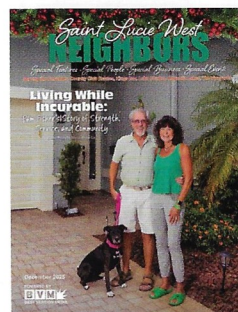
NOVEMBER 2025
